Number = SEGMENT 1 - SEGMENT 2 - SEGMENT 3 – SEGMENT 4 - SEGMENT 5 –SEGMENT 6

E.g: = VAL - 93 - 10 - 1 - M - 1

Segment 2	Year of registration with SMDC	E.g. 1963	63	
Segment 3	Whether the person being registered is Seychellois or expatriate	Seychellois	10

Segment 4	Whether the person being registered is medical practitioner or dentist	Medical Practitioner	1	Medical is first in the acronym SMDC
		Dentist	2	Dental is second in the acronym SMDC
Segment 5	Whether the person being registered is male or female	Male	M

Segment 6	Sequence of registration in the year of registration with SMDC	Sequence	Can take any number from 1 to infinity depending on the sequence	

Hence, assuming that DR John Doe is a Seychellois male doctor who was the first to register with SMDC in 1963, he would have the number:

DOE-63-10-1-M-1

His wife DR Jane Doe who is a dentist and an expatriate at registration and who was the second person to register in 1963 would have the following number:

DOE-63-20-2-F-2

Their daughter, DR SYLVIA DOE who is also an expat dentist who qualified way after them but who is registered with SMDC the same year as them, just after the mother, would have number

DOE-63-20-2-F-3

Please note that if after registering with SMDC a doctor changes his/her last name for whatever reason, changes nationality from expatriate to Seychellois or vice versa or happens to have a sex change!!! from either gender to the other, the unique number will remain unchanged.

This means that doctors and dentists can almost completely make out what their own unique number is going to be. **HENCE IT IS GOING TO BE EASY TO REMEMBER.** The only segment of the number that must be entirely determined by the SMDC Administration Office will be the sequence of registration in the year of registration.
